Professor Dolak's research includes issues at the intersections of patent law and judicial procedure, patent law and the media, and patent law and legal ethics. She served as law clerk to the Hon. Paul F. Michel, now Chief Judge, U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit, and currently serves as a member of the Federal Circuit's Advisory Council. She chaired the SU Law faculty reading groups convened at the request of the ABA Standing Committee on the Federal Judiciary to evaluate the writings of Supreme Court nominees Samuel Alito and Sonia Sotomayor. She is a regular panelist on "The Ivory Tower Half Hour", a weekly public affairs discussion program on WCNY-TV.
