As Counsel to New York State Office of Homeland Security, Ms. Shkreli is responsible for identifying current and emerging key public policy issues that could have significant impact on the State, analyzing the political climate associated with the issues, and preparing strategic and tactical recommendations for policy positions. Ms. Shkreli was charged with the responsibility of implementing Chapter 537 of the Law of 2005, which created a \$15 million Enhanced Security Guard Training Tax Credit Program for building owners. She is further responsible to ensure administrative efficiency and compliance with federal laws, regulations, and standards of disbursement of federal funds and administration of federal projects. Additionally, Ms. Shkreli was appointed the New York Homeland Security Director's primary liaison with the White House Office of Management and Budget for intergovernmental review of federal assistance to the State of New York. Ms. Shkreli is an Adjunct Lecturer in Business Law at the City University of University of New York and is pursuing her Masters Degree in Security Studies at the Naval Postgraduate School.
